Background

The role

We now have a vacancy for a venue support colleague to help us ensure our centres are kept in perfect condition by completing both housekeeping and maintenance tasks to maintain a welcoming environment for our clients.

You will be based in Edinburgh, with regular visits to our centres in Glasgow. On occasion, you will be required to visit our centres in Northern Scotland.

Your responsibilities will include general maintenance, minor repairs, and housekeeping. You will also be required to complete deliveries of equipment and materials to our centres.

You will be skilled and hard-working, with outstanding problem-solving abilities. You will also take pride in your work and understand how important a clean and well-presented venue is to our clients' experience. You will have a 'can-do' attitude and take ownership of your responsibilities. You will be approachable and confident when interacting with our colleagues and clients.

To be eligible for this position you will need to have a full (clean) driving licence. Successful applicants will be subject to a PVG check.





Typical duties

- Ensuring fixtures and fittings are in good working order, making minor repairs where necessary.
- Minor electrical work such as changing light bulbs and strip lights, rewiring plugs, installing light fittings, changing fuses, etc.
- Minor plumbing such as replacing washers in taps, clearing blockages in wastewater piping, ensuring correct pressure in boilers, etc.
- Minor joinery work such as building and installing shelving, partitions and door locks, etc.
- Management of waste and rubbish.
- Ensuring that our high standards of cleanliness are maintained by cleaning contractors and reporting any issues to management.
- Moving furniture and equipment within our venues.
- · Making deliveries, collecting and dropping materials, hardware, boxes and centre supplies.
- Assembling furniture or equipment, including flatpack.
- Painting and decorating, including wallpapering where necessary.
- · Repairing flooring and replacing floor tiles.
- Identifying and resolving any safety hazards.
- Liaising with contractors and other workers.
- Cleaning and basic refurbishing of soft furnishings.
- Able to regularly handle/carry/deliver items (small and large) to centres and offices. Some travel throughout Scotland will be necessary.
- Cleaning duties such as hoovering and washing external parts of the building frontage.

Skills required

- A minimum of two years' working experience in a similar role.
- Solid experience with housekeeping & cleaning.
- Experience in maintenance the ability to complete minor repairs such as fixing door locks and rewiring light fittings.
- Ability to work with hardware tools and power equipment.
- Knowledge of health and safety procedures and precautions, including COSHH regulations and an awareness of health and hygiene procedures.
- · Literacy and numeracy skills sufficient to check delivery notes, measurements, etc.
- Extremely organised, with time management skills.
- Confident and friendly when interacting with colleagues, clients, and contractors.
- Ability to resolve problems and adhere to health and safety guidelines.
- Physically strong capable of working with machinery or moving heavy equipment.
- Being flexible
- Full, clean driving licence

Physical effort

At certain points of the day the post holder will be expected to undertake bending, lifting and stretching in the course of their duties, e.g. minor maintenance work, remedial painting and decorating, repairs to fixing, receiving deliveries of goods and equipment, setting out and putting away furniture.
